

Encore Presents its Heart to Heart Awards to Paul Libin and Laura Penn at its Annual Spring Benefit

Setting the stage for the May 9th Annual Heart to Heart Awards Presentation and Benefit was the lovely Penthouse Floor at Mutual of America. These awards are given to acknowledge the work of individuals, groups and corporations who have made contributions to the betterment of New York City, especially the Times Square/ theater community. This year's Heart to Heart recipients were Paul Libin, Executive Vice President of the Jujamcyn Theaters, and Laura Penn, Executive Director of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society (SDC). The program commenced with a gracious welcome from Benefit Chairpersons George and Christine Stonbely and President of Encore's Board of Directors, William Flynn, followed by an invocation from the Reverend John Duffell of Church of the Blessed Sacrament. Serving as the Master of Ceremonies for the evening was Robert Wankel, President of The Shubert Organization.

Paul Libin is a name synonymous with the theater community, having begun his professional career in the theater as an actor to now serving as Executive Vice President of the Jujamcyn Theaters. Throughout his illustrious career, Mr. Libin has worked as a director, lighting designer, technical director, stage manager, company manager, managing director and general manager. In 1958, Mr. Libin produced his first play in New York and went on to produce more than 250 Broadway and Off-Broadway shows and productions on tour.

Seniors Enjoy A Hidden Harbor Boat Tour

Ms. Penn previously served as a Vice President of the League of Resident Theatres, held a two-term appointment as Chair of the Seattle Arts Commission, and was a steering committee member of the Seattle Chamber of Commerce's Forum on Race.

The recipient of many awards, including nine Tony Awards, Mr. Libin is also the former Chairman of The Broadway League and a member of the League's Executive Committee, the owner of The Circle in the Square Theatre and President of the Circle in the Square Theatre School. Mr. Libin was the Producing Director of Circle in the Square Theatre for thirty years and served as President of the League of Off-Broadway Theatres for thirty years, as well.

Mr. Libin is currently President of Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS, a trustee of The Actors Fund, Actors' Equity Pension Fund, Treasurers' Pension Fund, and an Adjunct Professor of Theatre Arts at Columbia University.

In 2003, Mr. Libin was awarded the Eugene O'Neill Medallion and in 2004 he received the Eugene O'Neill Foundation Tao House Award. As a long-time friend and supporter of Encore Community Services, Encore was delighted to honor Mr. Lbin with its Heart to Heart Award presented to him by Charlotte St. Martin, Executive Director of The Broadway League and a former Heart to Heart Award recipient.

Laura Penn joined the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society (SDC) as its Executive Director in 2008, after a twentyfive year career in LORT management. During her tenure at SDC, Ms. Penn has begun forging partnerships with key industry constituents, focusing on improving the Union's communications capabilities and expanding its reach and scope within the industry. She has led negotiations for Broadway and LORT management and continues to spearhead challenge-specific initiatives to educate and empower SDC members and partners within the industry.

Ms. Penn is an active member of the Broadway Coalition of Unions and Guilds (COBUG) and is a member of the Tony Administration Committee and Freehold Studio/Theatre Lab. as well as a nominator for the Astaire Awards. As a founder of the annual event, Broadway Salutes, which celebrates Broadway artists, Ms. Penn continues to serve as its Co-Chair.

Before joining SDC, Ms. Penn was the Managing Director of Seattle's Intiman Theatre for fourteen years. Under her leadership, Intiman received the 2006 Regional Theatre Tony Award. She has served as an advocate and catalyst for civic dialogue and community building in the Puget Sound, and she received the "Seattle Distinguished Citizen" Medal from Mayor Paul Schell in 2001. Prior to working at Intiman, Ms. Penn was Associate Managing Director at Seattle Repertory Theatre and worked with Bob Alexander and the Living Stage Theatre Company at Arena Stage.
